Pastor's Report

Church Family, for this quarterly report I am submitting something different than usual. Much of what I want to brag on is other church leaders who will be submitting their own reports. We have much to praise the Lord in the past 3 months and we celebrate the Lord in each monthly UPLIFT service. With a new school season upon us, we will have greater opportunities to serve Him by serving others. Therefore, I chose to submit my devotional message from the August UPLIFT service in hopes that it speaks to your heart and helps us all develop an attitude of service that glorifies God.

For the Lord, Not Men

Colossians 3:23 “Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for men...”^{NIV} Would you agree there's an important difference between doing something for people and doing something for God? Would you agree that God always deserves our best effort?

The four FBCBH values that represent our vision & mission are Faithfulness, Excellence, Equipping, and Loving. Those four values work well together and are not hard to find in the teachings of Jesus. Let's talk about Excellence but first, we must look at a condition where excellence is lacking— it is mediocrity.

Mediocrity is indifference or being “lukewarm”, and look at what the Lord Jesus has to say about that: **Rev 3:14-16** “These are the words of the Amen, the faithful and true witness, the ruler of God's creation. I know your deeds, that you are neither cold nor hot. I wish you were either one or the other! So, because you are lukewarm— neither hot nor cold— I am about to spit you out of my mouth.” *Spit* is better translated as puke or vomit.

The church at Laodicea thought that it was spiritually rich, having all the truth of God's Word, and therefore not open to further light. It regarded itself as theologically pure and complete, needing no improvement. But the church was actually, in the words of Jesus, “wretched, miserable, poor, blind and naked”. This means that they were spiritually blind and couldn't fathom that they were exactly opposite to what they thought they were, and because they didn't have Christ's robe of righteousness, they were spiritually naked and about to be vomited out of His mouth.

What should motivate us to serve people, except our love for God? God deserves our love, and He demands that we love others in the same way He does.

Mark 12:30-31 Jesus said it this way: Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' ³¹ The second is this: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no commandment greater than these."

Mediocrity and laziness have no place in the Christian's life. There's surely no place for these standards in Christ's church either! Think about it. What is a major strength of ministry in the church? Before you say the work of the Holy Spirit, think about how God frames ministry. I have added boldness to certain words for emphasis.

Mark 6:7 “Calling the Twelve to him, he sent them out **two by two** and gave them authority over evil spirits.”

Acts 2:1-2 “When the day of Pentecost came, they were **all together** in one place.”

Acts 2:4 “All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them.”

Acts 2:42-45 “They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. ⁴³ **Everyone** was filled with awe, and many wonders and miraculous signs were done by the apostles. ⁴⁴ **All the believers were together** and had everything in common.”

Acts 2:46 “Every day they continued to **meet together** in the temple courts.”

Acts 4:31-32 “After they prayed, the place where they were meeting was shaken. And they were **all** filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke the word of God boldly. ³² **All the believers were one in heart and mind.**”

We are empowered by the Holy Spirit but for the purpose of working **TOGETHER** in Kingdom ministry. The Greek word Ekklesia is commonly translated as “church.” Ekklesia is defined as “a called-out **assembly** or congregation.” People working together. For Christians to meet a standard of excellence to the glory of God, we must work well together to accomplish God’s kingdom plan and His purpose fulfilled.

Unlike NFL football teams, we have no superstars in church except for Christ alone. To win, though, we must play as a unified team with excellence for the good of the church. A worship team, therefore, must invest themselves in each rehearsal **together**, even if individually they are talented, for it is in the harmonizing of voices that exalt Christ when they blend the beauty of their gifts. The pastor preaches alone but still must rehearse diligently in preparation of the worship service. Nevertheless he must still work in partnership with others to coordinate a service. A pastor can only successfully lead in the mission of the church with excellence when he surrounds himself with fellow servants more gifted than he. That goes for all ministry that we do at FCBH.

We’re a team– a church family. To achieve excellence for the Lord, we must work together, pooling our talents to give the Lord the best we’ve got because He deserves our very best. To offer God mediocrity in anything we do, from our financial gifts to our talents and abilities, is an insult to Him.

Rom 12:1-2 “Therefore, I urge you, brothers, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God — this is your spiritual act of worship. Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is— his good, pleasing and perfect will.”

When guests walk into our church, do we want to convey to them that we really love the Lord? How do we do that? Does it matter *how* we greet them? Sure it does! What does it communicate to them if our Worship Team or preacher come across ill-prepared? Does it say we don’t view God as though He deserves our very best? That’s how it would speak to me! And would I want to return to a church where I hope to grow and develop spiritually when I perceive their standard of giving to the Lord is mediocre? No!

Working for God, as opposed to working for other people, changes our perspective as we view our endeavors in light of what He has done for us. When it comes to giving, God gave us His very best when He gave us Jesus! Shouldn’t we want to give Him our best? Giving my best may not be as good as you giving your best but both God and others appreciate it when we leave nothing behind. Our labor then becomes an offering to God. We not only worship God at church on Sunday, but our labor throughout the week is an offering of worship and thanksgiving to the One who has given us everything we have. He is worthy of our best effort.

We're just a few weeks away from when we will be back in Central Ridge Elementary School teaching the gospel of Jesus Christ to children. Our first club is September 13th.

The last couple of weeks have been busy with the GNC team members in planning meetings and two of our members in TCE1 class. I'm proud to announce that Jim Clark-Rosa and Carmen Pedroza-Oliva have completed the Child Evangelism Fellowship 4-week training that's needed to teach a bible lesson in the club. We now have eight qualified teachers! During our last planning meeting all teaching assignments, including memory verse, wondertime, and missionary story, were assigned to our teaching team. During this quarter, the administrator teamed up with the financial secretary to begin the transfer all the church's bank accounts from Brannen Bank to TRUIST Bank (a merger of the former SunTrust and BB&T Banks). In addition, we will be cancelling all our current Synovus Bank credit cards and opening new accounts with TRUIST. The purpose of these moves is threefold:

1) Cancellation of the Synovus credit card. We have been paying a yearly fee to Synovus Bank for the privilege of using their card. However, we have not been earning any reward points. With TRUIST, we earn reward points for using the card. The rewards points can be traded for cash to benefit our church and its programs. Additionally, we will not pay a yearly fee.

2) Multi-functional Transfer of Money. We are now able to transfer money within a few business days from any church account to any individual, company, vendor, contractor, or bank. This is done via several different programs: online bill pay, the Zelle system, the Automatic Clearing House (ACH) process or wire transfers. Using ACH services, we are now able to make automatic direct deposits from our church account directly to an employee's bank account. Thus, saving postage and check fees, while guaranteeing deposits and eliminating mail delays.

3) Consolidation of banking functions. Previously, the church maintained credit cards checking/savings accounts, and a certificate of deposit in three different financial institutions. Consolidating all banking functions with TRUIST ensures uniform policy and management of all banking services... one-stop shop. The transfer of banking services to TRUIST will also drive some changes in current church operations:

A) Management of credit cards. Credit cards will no longer be signed out to individuals on the register maintained in the church office. Instead, credit cards will be issued to designated personnel for the purchase of goods/services for church operations or for a specific designated funds (e.g., Good News Club, Change-for-Change, Kids On The Rise, etc.). This will ensure that there is no mismatch of accounts, and that the proper fund is charged. It will also provide a more accurate record for each account and expedite reconciliation.

B) Direct Deposits. Most church employees have already opted to have their paychecks automatically deposited to their individual bank accounts.

C) Online Bill Pay. The church will be setting up bill pay services for all our vendors and service providers. Thus, saving the costs of envelopes, postage, and check fees, eliminating possible

late fees, while guaranteeing payments. We sincerely believe that these changes are a significant improvement and are most beneficial for the overall operation of the church. Most important, the new banking features will ease the accounting burden on the Financial Secretary, while improving the efficiency of our financial management system. Until the transfers of all funds has been completed, the financial report will appear differently. You will notice that both financial institutions, Brannen and TRUIST, will indicate money in the account (see the Financial Secretary's report).

Good news! The ramp project is nearing the construction stage. We recently received from our contractor the site drawing for the construction of the ramp. Once reviewed and approved by the Church's Trustees, the contractor will send the drawings to the County Board to get a building permit. The contractor does not anticipate any delays with the County Board's approval and issuing the permit. Once the contractor receives the building permit, construction of the ramp will begin.

During this quarter, the Church acquired the service of a mowing contractor. After initially adjusting to the loss of some employees, the company is back on track with its service. Each month during this quarter brought a large turnout of volunteer personnel for Church Appreciation. Volunteers began each session with prayer, which was followed up with a generous helping of donuts and coffee. Members joined in several small teams to trim bushes and pull up weeds. On Church Appreciation in August, a small band of eager, brave, and courageous volunteers attacked the trimming of the palm tree on the eastside of the Franklin building. Thanks to their efforts, the appearance of the east face of the Franklin building was appreciably improved.

The Church needs volunteers for the Building & Grounds Team to join with Team Leader, Stacy Ash. We are looking for 2-3 devoted members to help Stacy plan, organize, and direct the efforts of the volunteers in the repair and maintenance of our Church facilities and campus. The church, after 3 ½ decades, is starting to show signs of wear and tear. We all want the First Baptist Church of Beverly Hills to shine bright and provide a welcome invitation for all coming to the worship services and other church activities.
